The Government of the Bahamas has discussed plans to reform its energy sector through a partial-privatization of BEC and by introducing regulation-by-contract principles to meet the capacity for future growth, implementing more economically viable renewable energy sources, and modernizing the energy sector. How much power does the Bahamas have? The Bahamas Electricity Corporation (BEC) controls 438 megawatts (MW) of generation capacity, while Grand Bahama Power Corporation (GBPC) controls the remaining 98 MW. Generation is currently fueled by all imported petroleum with a mix of diesel (56.5%) and heavy fuel oil (43.5%), totaling 1,930 gigawatt-hours (GWh) for the entire country. Will the Bahamas have a solar water heating system? In the next decade, the Bahamas aims to have solar water heating systems on 20% to 30% of all households, which has the potential of adding 200 GWh of heat for water per year.
